In 2015, she experienced what she deemed "the trip of a lifetime," as she overcame her fear of flying to travel to Lourdes. She loved St. Joseph Church and the many worshippers she met there. Later in her life, she forged countless friendships with her "pool

people” at the Chalet pool, in Willow Springs, and the Life Time fitness pool, in Burr Ridge. Her relationship with her precious granddaughters gave her strength after the loss of Elmer. 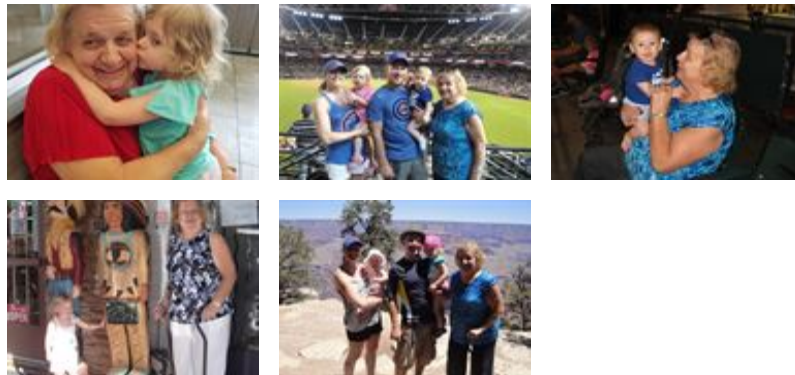
